

# COVID-19 BUSINESS ASSISTANCE INFORMATION

## **U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA)**

Federal assistance for small businesses (usually defined as companies with up to 500 employees) is coordinated by SBA. In addition to SBA's usual resources, there are additional programs available due to the COVID-19 outbreak. These include:

- *Economic Injury Disaster Loans and Loan Advance:* All U.S. small businesses can apply for an Economic Injury Disaster Loan advance of up to \$10,000. The Loan program also provides working capital loans up to \$2 million. You can apply [here](#).
- *Paycheck Protection Program:* Businesses are eligible for loans up to \$10 million to maintain employees and salaries. You can find more information [here](#).

## **Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC)**

Michigan small businesses affected by COVID-19 can apply for the Michigan Small Business Relief Program. Grants of up to \$10,000 are available to qualifying businesses with 50 employees or fewer. Loans up to \$200,000 are available for qualifying companies with up to 100 employees.

## **Detroit Economic Growth Corporation (DEGC)**

The Detroit Small Business COVID-19 Relief Grant Fund provides grants from \$2,500 to \$10,000. Companies with fewer than 50 employees and less than \$1 million in average net income can apply. Find more information [here](#).

## **TCF Bank & Wayne County**

TCF Bank and Wayne County have established the Small Business Relief Loan Fund. This Fund provides microloans up to \$50,000 for businesses with fewer than 100 employees and revenue of \$1 million or less. You can find more information [here](#).

## **Dream Maker Fund**
